# 2024 IN FIGURES



On Safer Internet Day (SID) 2024, about 19,000 schools and over 17,000 organisations were involved in Safer Internet Centre actions across Europe alone. Many more stakeholders were reached across the globe, with almost 190 countries and territories participating in celebrations in some way.









More than 2,100 events involved youth participation throughout 2024.

**Cyberbullying** was the **main issue** discussed with helplines, with 14% of calls related to it.

**Sexual issues** accounted for 24% of the total, which included **grooming**, **sextortion**, **online sexual coercion of children**, and **nonconsensual sharing of intimate images**.
